Event Location – Irving Convention Center at Las Colinas, 500 West Las Colinas Boulevard, Irving, TX 75039

Quilt Entry/Registration (online only) – Begins 4/1/22; Ends 6/5/22

Registration for Expo Classes and Workshops – mid-May Quilt Check-In/Drop Off - Sunday, August 14, 12:00 – 4:00 pm at Irving Convention Center

Quilt Pick Up - Saturday, August 20, 5:45 pm - 7:00 pm



Quilt Entry Requirements

All entries, photos and fees must be submitted online at NorthTexasQuiltFestival.com.

If assistance is needed, please contact your guild NTQF representative or guilt show chair.

A separate entry with the non-refundable entry fee is required for each quilt entered in the show. The entry fee is \$25 for a host guild member and \$40 for non-members.

Host guilds include: Bear Creek Quilt Guild, Fort Worth Modern Quilt Guild, Fort Worth Quilt Guild, Irving Quilt Guild, Quilters' Guild of Arlington, Trinity Valley Quilters' Guild.

Each entry must include a color photo of your quilt. A "work-in-progress" photo is acceptable as long as the quilt is recognizable, although a pattern photo is not.

All quilts entered must have been completed within the last five years (2017-2022).

If an entry is withdrawn after July 15 or is not submitted at quilt check-in for the show, the entrant may not be allowed to submit an entry for the next North Texas Quilt Festival.

All entries must be brought in person on the drop off date. No entries will be accepted or returned by mail.

General Information

Quilts must remain on display for the entire festival and must be clean, in good condition, free of animal hair and smoke.

Quilts will be accepted in the order registered with total number of entries limited per the site and participating guild. Each entrant may only enter three (3) quilts with no more than two (2) per category. Please specify order of preference for each entry.

Quilt width must be 96" or less due to site limitations. Quilts wider than 96" WILL NOT be accepted.

Quilts over 90" in height have special sleeve requirements. Please see the sleeve requirements in the Quilt Preparation section.

The Show Committee reserves the right to refuse any entry that it deems inappropriate or that does not meet the requirements.

Quilts will be placed in size categories by the Show Committee based on the total entries received.

Entrants are responsible for their own insurance on all items. The completed Entry Form releases North Texas Quilt Festival and Original Sewing & Quilt Expo, its officers, agents and volunteers from all liability.

Ribbons and Awards will be given at the discretion of the Judges and Show Committee to winning quilts.



NTQF Show Calendar (cont.)

Definitions

Quilt Maker - NTQF defines the MAKER as the person who made the quilt top. The quilt-top MAKER'S status determines whether a quilt belongs in the Artisan Division or the Master Division. The status of the person who did the quilting plays no part in the Maker's status as Artisan or Master.

Artisan Division – If **all** of the following statements are true you may enter in the Artisan Division:

- I have never classified as a Master in the past.
- I have never engaged in a quilt event or activity for monetary profit (more than \$2,000 in a year). i.e., I have never formally taught quilting, quilt-related or wearable arts techniques.
- I have not published a pattern or book on quilt-related techniques within the last 5 years.

Master Division – If <u>any</u> of the following statements are true you must enter under the Master Division:

- I have been classified as a Master in the past.
- I have engaged in a quilt event or activity for monetary profit (more than \$2,000 in a year). i.e., I have formally taught quilting, quilt-related or wearable arts techniques, or quilted professionally.
- I have published a pattern or book on quilt-related techniques within the last 5 years.
- I have won a Best of Show and/or lifetime total of two First Place Ribbons, or a combination of, in any quilt show including the NTQF.

One-Person Quilt – Only one person did the entire construction of the quilt. The quilt was pieced or appliqued, hand or machine quilted and bound by only one person.

Two-Person Quilt – A quilt to which two people contributed work. If someone else did any of the piecing, quilting or binding on a quilt, it automatically belongs in a Two-Person Category.

Group Quilt – A quilt to which three or more people contributed work. If three or more people were involved in the piecing, quilting or binding of a quilt, it belongs in a Group Quilt Category.

Quilting – All quilts must be hand or machine-quilted. No tied or tacked quilts are allowed with the exception of Crazy Quilts, which may be tied.



I first saw this idea on a You Tube video by Jordan Fabrics. By placing the weight on the far end of a long ruler it keeps the ruler from slipping. I have found the rubber or neoprene coated weights works best for me. Make sure at least one side is flat to prevent the weight from rolling off the table. I have also started using it with my strip cutter and it is a great help to produce straighter cuts.

Retreat Round-up

I mentioned Cactus Rose Hideaway in last month's article and if you were to draw a line due north from this location, across highway 20 to Santo/Lone Camp you'd be at the Rock House retreat center.

I first visited this spot when I saw a facebook note about a new location and a 'soft' opening to work out all the kinks. The owner, Jo Lynn Coupland was offering a discounted first timers rate for some honest feedback...a bargain and I was IN!!

I was not disappointed. Out in the country, yes, but I'm one that really does like to stay put once I'm settled in and this was a great spot for that. The owner is a quilter and designed the sewing space with quilters in mind. There are lovely personal touches everywhere, plug in spots above the tables to keep from having to crawl around underground, a pin cushion/thread catcher at every station and sturdy, comfortable Bernina chairs at each sewing station. There is a chef on hand for provided meals and most everything is made from scratch...and delicious. I visited Rock House again for a collage class and the chef was still there and the food did not disappoint. My Bee visited in February and I'm happy to report that Bridgit is still the cook!! Jo Lynn is happy to check in with the retreaters and each time has provided some demos or projects to break up the personal sewing time. At my last visit she introduced us to a sewing repair person who came in and spent the day servicing/cleaning any and all machines that wanted it. The cost was excellent for the convenience and professionalism provided. We are hoping to have him visit us at Sunset in April! There was also the opportunity for a massage and I usually opt for one. The therapist was very good and a welcome break from sewing!

What they say: Located in the beautiful rural setting of the Texas Hill Country, Rock House Retreat is in Lone Camp, Texas. A short drive from DFW, approximately 60 miles west of Fort Worth is a perfect getaway for a mid-sized group (up to 16). Each room accommodates three people with a private bathroom.

What I say: I will continue to support this location, I enjoy the space, the drive isn't too far and it's just cozy enough for a group of 12 or so. More than that, it's a little crowded in the sewing area. The website is woefully out of date and it's not easy to book a retreat online, your best bet is to call Jo Lynn and find out what is available. The pricing is difficult to locate on the website, but her current rates for a Thurs-Sunday retreat is \$290 with meals included, beginning with dinner on Thursday. She will let you come on Wednesday for an extra \$25, with an arrival around dinner time. There is ample space for your food and drinks in a large side by side refrigerator in the supply room and a smaller beverage fridge in the sewing room. For down time, there are two lazy boy chairs in a side cubby right off the sewing space with a TV available. Its a comfortable spot to read and relax. The design walls surround the sewing room, but there are a number of spots located away from the perimeter of the room that aren't afforded a place to design your blocks/quilt. Jo Lynn has a few staples for sale if you need it with bolts of fabric, notions and some precuts. Overall, this is a great Bee retreat location if your group numbers are less than 12. Check it out!

Sharing knowledge, encouraging creativity, and teaching new skills are personal passions. He also loves to travel, especially in Asia, and enjoys sharing his experiences and inspiration through travel photos and stories.

Workshop: Stitched Paper Collage

Paper collage meets quilting in this fun and adventurous online workshop.

YES, YOU CAN STITCH PAPER WITH YOUR HOME SEWING MACHINE!

3 hours: Using your home sewing machine, create immediate creative collages with paper and thread. No waiting around for glue to dry! I will guide you through a series of hands-on exercises and share my 20+ years of experience as a paper collage artist, including all my tips and ideas for simple but striking compositions.

This workshop is a 3-hour live-stream event, conducted on Zoom, consisting of live instruction plus a few videos (no recording, please). You should have the current version of Zoom installed on your computer or laptop. Guidance for getting started will be sent in advance of the workshop.

ZOOM WORKSHOP DETAILS

- Discuss what papers work best, from art store purchases to junk mail
- Cut base paper into standard 6" x 6" shapes or print templates from supplied PDF
- · Mark off composition area with drafting tape guides
- Test your sewing machine stitch length and tension
- Cut and/or tear up paper to be added to your composition
- Sew strips of paper onto base paper, building as you go
- Carefully remove tape guides
- · Review options for framing and additional construction ideas

A complete PDF supply list, plus step-by-step notes and templates will be emailed to each participant. Class sizes are limited to ensure one-on-one time. Tips will be given for choosing papers that work best for this technique.

This is a beginning to intermediate level class. You should be comfortable using your sewing machine, and it should be in good working order. I look forward to sharing and sewing with you!

SUPPLY LIST

- Sewing machine
- Magazine or junk mail to cut up
- Base paper cut into 6" x 6" squares: This can be anything from laser paper to something nicer. I like to use BFK Rives printmaking paper. You can also cut up a brown kraft paper bag to use as your base paper. Iron if wrinkly, but don't iron over the glued parts, as the glue will leak through and stain. Make 8 to 10 base squares.
- Sewing thread: any color, cotton, poly or rayon in 30, 40, or 50 weight
- · Drafting tape or blue painter's tape
- A small pad of Post-It's
- X-Acto knife or box cutter
- Scissors for paper
- Small scissors for trimming threads
- Metal edge ruler or straight edge tool
- Self-healing cutting mat or cardboard to cut on

Optional:

 Handmade paper, craft paper, watercolor paper: any paper with color, texture or pattern that you like can be stitched into a paper collage, as long as it is not too heavy like cardstock

This is a beginning to intermediate level class. You should be comfortable using your sewing machine, and it should be in good working order. I look forward to sharing and sewing with you!
