



President's Message

Hi BCQG Friends,

About three years ago, I came across what I thought was a sweet volunteer opportunity. It became apparent that my then 48 year old wedding gown was not going to be used again. I decided that it should be. I "Googled and Gathered" information on various ways to make use of an unneeded wedding gown and became interested in a project called "Angel Baby Gowns." Previously worn wedding dresses are made into burial gowns for the tiniest babies that are born asleep. I was interested in making some baby gowns myself from my own dress. I searched for a pattern online, printed it, and proceeded to cut up my dress.

The patterns came in four sizes. The sizes ranged between 7 pounds and 1 ½ pounds. The gowns weren't easy to make, for more reasons than one. They were like making doll clothes. Sometimes the seams made tight curves and were difficult to navigate. But more than that, my thoughts were of the sad families that would have need of the gowns. I found myself thinking of them constantly as I sewed. Often I had to stop sewing and grieve. After many starts and stops, I eventually completed nine tiny garments to be used for infant burials. I turned in my volunteer hours to BCQG Community Service projects. The gowns were donated to the JPS NICU to distribute as needed.



Please review the Community Service page in our handbook. Then think about these facts gathered by Debra Heid, our Community Service Chair.

In 2021, we logged 1721.5 hours. In 2022, we logged 1091.5 volunteer hours. Debra and I believe that a couple of factors affected the decrease in hours. First was Covid. We did not meet in person for quite some time. I don't know about you, but I didn't even think about turning in volunteer hours during that time. Then, when we came back after Covid, we had gotten out of the habit of turning in hours. Those who consistently turned in hours, you are appreciated! I'm positive that many, like me, volunteered but just didn't say so.

Here is a list of ways you may earn volunteer hours.

- 1. Any way that you help with the annual quilt show counts. Time spent hanging quilts, making mini quilts for auction, fashioning boutique items, working at the show, all can be counted as volunteer hours.
- 2. All who work on a committee such as Quilts of Valor may count those hours spent creating quilts for our veterans. Each person may count meetings and work days. Quilting on the Quilts of Valor done by our long arm quilters can be counted.
- 3. Hours spent making baby and children's items for JPS or other children's charities can be counted.
- 4. Hours spent making quilts for Gatehouse can be counted.

Let's remember to count volunteer hours, outdo our numbers from last year, and protect our standing as a non-profit organization. You represent Bear Creek Quilt Guild. Any time you spend volunteering for the benefit of others, you are reflecting the goodness of our organization. Debra will have some sheets available at the next meeting that will make it easy to keep track of your hours.

I have a couple of housekeeping items for you. At the last meeting, I announced that we will be having a perfect attendance contest. If you attend I I meetings this year, you will be eligible for the drawing in December. One thing I failed to mention is that you need to be "there in the chair" to be eligible. Bear Creek Quilt Guild Board Zoom Meeting Minutes

January 3, 2023

President, Vicky Kidd, opened the meeting at 6:30 pm on ZOOM with the following officers and members present: Vicky Kidd, Kathi Runyan, Kathy Longo, Aleta Mayrose, Pam Roark, Kyle Mills, Beverly Douglas, and JoAnne Sheppard. Vicky welcomed everyone to the meeting. December 2022 Board minutes were reviewed and motion to accept was made by Kathi Runyan, with a second by Kyle Mills, and the motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Kyle reported for the month of December no income, expenses of \$524.51 (hospitality expenses, PO box rental, donation to Sew Many Blessings, and ZOOM account fee). Audit is scheduled for January 15, 2023, at Kyle's house for 2 pm, with Selena Woodward, Nancy Carr, and Aleta Mayrose on the audit committee.
