I used to teach my second-grade students how to pay attention to details. Do you remember "Glamour Shots?" We had several lessons on detail. They wrote lists of details about me. Then it came time for our culminating activity. They were asked to draw and color a picture of me using all the details they had written. I also stood before the class and posed for them while they created. These artists quickly became famous at our school when my class's works of art were displayed in the hallway under the title," Mrs. Kidd's Glamour Shots." There were always visitors in the hallway admiring the "detailed" artwork. I like to think that their practice in paying attention to details was a help to them in their later lives.

As quilters, we pay attention to details when we carefully fashion our quilts. As you view photos in this newsletter, try to pick important details from each quilt shown. What colors do you see? What designs are there? Each quilt has a particular design that attracts us, and we respond in kind. Enjoy the BCQG Glamour Shots!

Vicky Kidd called the general meeting to order at 6:58 PM, thanking those with April birthdays for snacks this evening and recognized those members by having them stand.

A motion to approve the March general meeting minutes was made by Mary Nalley and seconded by Nancy Carr and the motion to approve the minutes passed.

JoAnne Sheppard introduced one new member, Barbara Ferris, and five visitors.

Kay Thomas gave the treasury report of \$8,013.62 in income with expenses of \$8,256.13 for a net loss of \$242.51.

New Business

In the absence of a Zoom board meeting in May we discussed a gathering of the board members in person where it was preferred to have a daytime meeting to discuss suggestions from members of the guild with the board. Possible dates and times were discussed with finalization occurring after the general meeting, to be outlined in the board meeting minutes after it is accomplished and included in the May Member Newsletter.

Past BCQG President and member, Paula Burda, recently passed away. A card was sent to the family from the guild. The information regarding a service was made available and members were notified how to access the address to send personal messages to her family.

An announcement was made regarding a drawing for a quilt kit in June. Tickets for the kit are \$2 and were made available for purchase during the meeting.

Ongoing Business

The Perfect Attendance contest continues! Please continue to attend as regularly as you can. We always have wonderful speakers and plenty of fun. There will be a drawing in December for members with perfect attendance.

Old Business

We have completed the extension of the rental contract for Bessie Mitchell House, to continue through June 2025. We will not have to change venue for any meetings during the time from now through June 2025. The only change in the contract is that our hours changed from 6:30-9:30 to 6:00-9:00. We need to include our setup time in our contracted hours, not in addition to our hours.

Committee Reports

Beverly Douglas reported the availability of tickets for our upcoming quilt show, as well as T-shirts, and restated the deadlines for show entries and encouraged members to participate in as many ways as possible.

Beverly also repeated the call for Quilt of Valor recipient recommendations and deadlines for our November meeting program.

Mona Levingston reported on the success of the recent retreat at Sunset and announced the dates for next year's retreat, April 10 – 13, 2025.

Nancy Carr reminded all present of the upcoming May meeting speaker, Sally Brown, Every Quilt has a Story.

Show and Tell was emceed by Betty Reisch with photography by Michelle Lewis.

After a quick break Nancy Carr introduced our speaker, Toni Oyler, a recently certified Judy Niemeyer instructor, who showcased her productions of Judy Niemeyer Quiltworx quilt patterns and the impact of changes to fabric used to produce dramatically distinct outcomes.

Vicky Kidd and all members present thanked Toni for an entertaining presentation and Vicky then adjourned the meeting at 8:36 PM.



Subscription Boxes

By Kathi Runyan I promised some reviews of subscription boxes that I have never personally gotten or subscribed to so here is another that might interest you!

The Fort Worth Fabric Studio is a LOCAL online only (mostly) retailer that has a monthly box available. It is a bit more costly (in my opinion) but it does provide a good haul! There is usually some fabric precuts, charm packs and fat quarters seem to be the norm. A tool or notion, I've seen Moda scissors, small embroidery scissors with a pouch and a token extra either a coaster, sticker or some knick knack. Also included is the fabric and pattern necessary to complete a project, pillow, lap quilt, or table runner.

For the inclusive price of \$69.96 (shipping is included) you get this box every month. So I teased you with the fact that this is an online shop only, but I have experience with visiting and shopping at this retailer! HOW you ask, well at some point in the past I have purchased something from this store and was on their mailing list and in Feb I received an invite to a VIP event they hold there once a quarter. I quickly invited my quilty bestie to join me and we made a fun day of it, shop hopping first and then attending the 3 pm event. It was amazing! They gave us a lovely overview of the space, Zoomed in a guest speaker who introduced us to her fabric line and products (which were for sale at the Fabric Studio) provided nice refreshments and then turned us loose in the warehouse! Shopping to our wallets limits!! AND, there is a provided discount as part of being at this VIP experience on our total purchase. Even more fun, we all received a swag bag full of great stuff and they had at least 3 baskets FULL of products to raffle off to all the participants. Everyone got a ticket and then if you wanted to increase your chances you could purchase additional raffle chances at check out! I bought some extra tickets and did not win a basket, but I sure was excited for the chance to!

The Fort Worth Fabric Studio carries most of the main fabric lines in abundance and I wished I had a specific project in mind when I went there, but I was happy to just pick up a few yards of beauties that caught my eye. AND, I did see a few leftover subscription boxes, marked down a bit and with my included discount it would have been a bargain!

I'm sure if you go to their website and subscribe to their newsletter you might get an invite to their next event! If not, let me know if you are interested and then next one I get, I can forward to you! Happy sewing!


