President's Message

Hi Wonderful Quilters!

I thought you might find it interesting to learn the ins and outs involved in moving BCQG last meeting to a different venue.

In November 2023, I contacted our liaison to Grapevine Recreation about renewing our contract to use Bessie Mitchell House for 2024. She prepared the schedule and contract. When I received the contract, I noticed that the calendar excluded the date for the February meeting. Now, the same thing happened last year with one meeting. Someone beats us to scheduling and signs up for one of our dates before we can. The BCQG executive board decided to accept the offer of a classroom at the REC in place of Bessie Mitchell for one meeting. I was happy for the offer. That didn't happen; however, I was able to park in a not-too-distant spot. I always have lots of stuff to bring in. I made it into the building, very happy to arrive at the REC. To my dismay, the room was not set up in any way, shape, or form as I had requested. In fact, it was totally the opposite. I immediately started moving furniture! I was so lucky to have some early birds just jump in and help in any way they could. In the meantime, I saw Patience Griffin moving all her quilts in. I wanted to help her, and several others volunteered. She was about finished and told us to get the room set up. So, we eventually got most things set up in an acceptable manner.

We had no idea how many quilters were going to come. I just hoped that we would have a good group to support our speaker. I was thrilled to see the large group forming for our meeting. I kept going to the reception desk to ask for more chairs to be set up. I went and asked for more chairs 4 times! I counted 53 people in attendance. It was a quick count so may not be correct.

I sincerely hope that everyone in attendance learned something you did not know and had a wonderful time! I was unable to speak to everyone since I was running around like a chicken with its head cut off! (Yes, I'm showing my age by using that old quote. It describes me in the best possible manner. LOL!) Just know that I saw you! I'm sorry if I didn't get to speak to everyone or if I walked away in the middle of a conversation. I just get easily distracted if I see a need to be met and sometimes, I am off and running. My goal was for everyone to enjoy the meeting and hang out with great friends.

Patience Griffin was an absolute pleasure to be around! She is a world of knowledge, and it was enjoyable to receive just a tiny bit of what she had to offer. After the meeting Patience asked me where we had found such a fun and happy group of people. I said, "I know! They are the best!" I believe that to be fact! I appreciate your presence and constant support at every meeting. In March, we will be back at Bessie Mitchell. See you then!

To Guilds, Quilt Shops, Quilt show venues and Online. I teach at places like Smoky Mountain Quiltfest, International Quilt Market, John C. Campbell Folk School, and Road to California.

I am a Virtual Quilt Instructor.

I offer Virtual Lectures and Workshops for individuals, Quilt Guilds and Groups, and Quilt Shops. I also offer Hybrid events – a combination of in-person and virtual.

I am a Podcasting Quilter.

I created the first podcast for Quilters in 2005 – Quilting Stash. I’ve done more than a few podcasts.

I am a “Bernina Artisan Ambassador.

Annie will conduct a workshop entitled “Stash Buster.” Her kit fee is \$8. Members will be paying \$28 for the workshop which includes the kit. For nonmembers the cost will be \$35 plus the kit fee.

The workshop will be held at the Roanoke Public Library, 308 S. Walnut St., Roanoke. The doors of the library open at 10. The workshop will last until 4.

Last January, the Blue Bonnet Quilters Bee held a retreat at the Rockhouse Retreat Center. It is located in Santo, Texas just a little west of Weatherford. It is out in the country where the hills are just beginning to appear. When you first arrive you are greeted by barn quilts hanging on the gate at the entrance. It gives you a sense of peace, quiet and belonging. The facility is set up for small groups of about 13 to 15 people. It is well equipped with a kitchen and eating area just off the main quilting area. It has a small amount of material and other quilting items for sale off to the side.
