# **President's Message**

Hi Quilters!

Years ago, at the beginning of my teaching career, we were required to learn to use several machines that were outdated almost before we even learned to use them.

Before we had VHS or DVD, we used a little jewel called an 8mm (millimeter) film projector. One day a week for about 35-40 minutes, we showed 4 classes of second graders educational films that went along with our lessons for that week. We chose the films from our education support center. They were delivered to us each week in a bright green duffel bag.

As I stated earlier, we had all 4 classes together in one classroom. Since we were in Mary Ann's room, that meant that she was in charge of operating the projector. The rest of us were strategically placed to provide crowd control. As usual, the students viewed several interesting films and were questioned about their learning. We came to the last film and as far as we knew, everything was fine. Little did we know that Mary Ann had forgotten to attach the film to the empty spool so that the film would wind itself onto it for easy rewinding. Well. At the end of the film, Mary Ann shouted at us to come. We all stood looking at a huge pile of film on the floor. Oh gosh!

It was close to the end of the day, and students were dismissed. We gathered again to try to decide what on earth we could do to fix the film. Somehow, we needed to get that entire pile organized properly on the spool so we could rewind it. Everything had to be turned back in to the support center rewound, kind of like Blockbuster. We spread the film out across and around the room. We tried our best to achieve something with that mess. Eventually Mary Ann said she was giving up. She grabbed the hateful pile of film, walked to the office with it, and ceremonially deposited it in the bright green duffel bag.

We could only imagine the glee that opening the bright green duffel bag brought to the support center employees. They were so thrilled with what they saw that Mary Ann was banned from ordering films or showing them for the rest of the year.

Fortunately, we don't have to operate those machines anymore.

My favorite machines to operate now are sewing machines! There are things that can go wrong in the sewing process, however, a good seam ripper usually solves those problems.

By Kathi Runyan Last month I talked a little about subscription boxes, particularly the Christmas Advent or December daily gift boxes. I was a little surprised at how many there were, but as I've investigated further, I found that some of the holiday boxes were an extension of a regular monthly subscription. So, let's start there!

I'm no stranger to getting a monthly subscription, I've enjoyed book boxes, stash boxes and store boxes. At one time, Connecting Threads sponsored a build your stash box, and I got lots of pre cuts, yardage and threads. It was wonderful and a great place being a new quilter and had my own finely tuned stash already! Looking at their website, I don't think they currently offer this subscription. Two others for a new quilter to start, but I was way past I've had the pleasure of enjoying are the Fat Quarter Shop's Sew Sampler and Primitive Gathering's Quilt Box. Both were great deliveries that I looked forward to. Sew Sampler came every month, for the cost of \$29.95 plus shipping and tax. I got at least one kit with most of the fabric needed, tools, notions and stickers/pins or rulers. It had a great variety and was well worth the monthly cost. Things I did not use or already had went to the donation bag or gifts for my quilty friends!!

Primitive Gatherings started a Quilt Subscription 2 years ago and I was a charter member! I do love Lisa Bongean and met her at a retreat 3 years ago. She is a sassy ball of energy and just as pleasant in person as you see on her live videos. The boxes did not disappoint either. There were full projects, a continuing project for the year, a cross stitch pattern, some other goodies and caramels that are a local favorite. It was a great box with previews of new lines and patterns! It is delivered every other month and costs \$45 for each box, well worth the price for the treats you get. I'm on the lookout for other boxes, quilt related, and will share my finds with you soon! I'm off to retreat and have quite a few already scheduled for the year. See you soon!

Quilt of Valor News: We had an outstanding presentation in November, with quilts presented to SIX veterans. It's time to start thinking about the 2024 presentation, and to that end I have revised the information form. We will no longer refer to veterans as *nominees*. Any veteran with an honorable discharge is eligible to receive a quilt. So we are using the term *recipient*, and the form is a *referral*. Also it is important that we know the actual dates of service (year is fine, no need for date/month/year), rather than how many years were served. This information goes on the QOV Foundation web site when I enter them officially. We would also like to keep our recipients to the North Tarrant County area. Other guilds cover the south areas, and so if you know someone there you can refer to one of those guilds.
