

Retreat Round-up

For my next review of retreat locations it only seems fair to take a look at the most recent place I had a wonderful retreat experience, again! Cactus Rose Hideaway is located outside of Stephenville on a multi-acred property with an expansive multi purpose building for retreats, reunions or family gatherings. They advertise themselves as a lakeside retreat in a serene country setting and this is certainly a true statement.

I've been spending at least 2 retreats a year at Cactus Rose for the last 3 or 4 years and love the spacious work room, comfortable rooms and gourmet kitchen. Imagine my surprise this past weekend when I discovered a state of the art massage chair has been added to the workroom! I tried it out once and was in heaven.

What they say: Cactus Rose Hideaway is your country home away from home for weekdays, weekends, or a getaway for the entire week. We are a multi-purpose retreat center open to a variety of self-organized groups. Quilters, scrapbookers, and other craft groups will enjoy the Retreat Center's spacious workroom with 36 L-shaped work stations and excellent lighting.

What I say: All that is true plus so much more. I really enjoy the open sewing area, amenities such as a refrigerator in the sewing room for our snacks and goodies, 2 bathrooms conveniently located in the workroom and access to a television if there is a special program that can't be missed. The kitchen is a cook's dream with a giant grilltop for burgers, bacon and anything else that needs fixed. Most bee groups do their own cooking, but meals can be arranged for an additional fee. There is also a huge industrial refrigerator in the kitchen where all your fixings can be kept. I travel with some excellent cooks so it is always a pleasure! There is a quilt shop on site using the honor system, with discounts for retreaters. You should be able to find just about anything you need.

Downfalls....if they could be called that; it seems like Annis Clapp has thought of everything. There is no dishwasher, but all dishes are paper plates or bowls and plastic utensils are provided. There is ample silverware also for those that don't mind the clean up. Any pot or pan or tray you might need to prepare meals are also provided. At my retreat, one of the toilets misbehaved and it was fixed within hours of being reported, so responsiveness is swift and precise. Lastly, the WiFi is spotty sometimes, it seems to be stronger in the daytime hours, but you are in the country and solitude and quietness that goes with that is a bonus.

Speaking of bonuses....the owners are wonderful and very accommodating to most requests. There is a couch and two recliners for the times you just want to rest your eyes or read and now a massage chair too. The bedrooms vary in size, those with 4 or more beds have an on suite bath, others with 3 or less beds have a bathroom right outside the door nearby. Rates are per night and an early arrival can be added for half price. I encourage our members to check out Cactus Rose for your next group retreat and if you need an extra give me a call! I'm happy to go if I'm available!!

Bear Creek Quilt Guild Board Zoom Meeting Minutes Febuary 4, 2022

President, Kathi Runyan opened the meeting at 6:30 pm on ZOOM with the following officers and members present: Kathi Runyan, Nancy Carr, Kay Thomas, Kyle Mills, Kathy Longo, JoAnne Sheppard, Aleta Mayrose, Angela Hoss, Mary Nalley, Pam Roark, Michelle Lewis, and Beverly Douglas. Kathi welcomed everyone to the meeting. January Board minutes were reviewed and motion to accept was made by Nancy Carr, with a second by Kyle Mills, and the motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Kyle Mills reported an income of \$1197.00 (from memberships, advertising), disbursement of \$635.10 (for rent of Bessie Mitchell house, state tax due, and speaker costs), with a net of \$561.90.

<u>Unfinished Business:</u> Treasurer Audit went well; Kyle Mills had all the paperwork prepared and she thanked the committee who conducted the audit: Nancy Carr, Mary Nalley and Angela Hoss.

New Business:

- **Additional Microsoft license:** Discussion was held to purchase another license for Microsoft Publisher program at a cost of \$36.00 to use for Membership and Directory compilation. Motion to purchase another license was made by Nancy Carr, seconded by Kyle Mills, and with no objections, motion passed.
- **Upcoming workshop locations:** Aleta Mayrose working to find locations for upcoming guild workshops. Kathi Runyan is open to suggestions. Discussed ZOOM capable locations to maximize attendance. Aleta to look at some possibilities. More to follow.
- **Income Opportunity:** Kathi Runyan was contacted via email by Allison of "Sewing With Sarah," an online quilt store, to establish a relationship with the guild. Allison would offer discounts to guild members, and a percentage of guild purchase profits back to the guild. Kathi to forward email to board members for discussion at next board meeting.
- **Amazon Smile:** At a previous meeting, it was mentioned that Bear Creek Quilt Guild become a recipient of the Amazon Smile charitable program. Kathi asked if anyone wanted to volunteer to investigate this and let her know.
- **ZOOM:** Meetings on ZOOM will continue and Kathi asked for volunteers to man the camera at these meetings. Angela Hoss volunteered to do so at the next general meeting.
- **Guild Programs:** Aleta Mayrose reported that the speaker for February is Terri Gartman, and her topic is "Rainbow Scrap Challenge." Terri will share her scrap quilts and there will be a scrap quilt challenge for the guild. Each member will be choosing a color palette to make a mini quilt, 24 in. X 24 in. to enter in a contest for prize money. Voting will take place at the June guild meeting to determine the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners. All mini quilts will be entered in the Silent Auction at this year's North Texas Quilt show in August. Aleta will forward mini quilt requirements to members. For the March meeting, it was suggested we reach out to a local quilt shop to showcase their new tools, notions, etc.

Beekeeper: Pam Roark has updated the Bee information to share with the guild.

Membership: Michelle Lewis is taking membership applications until the end of February.
