

Retreat Round-up

What they say: Owners Laura and Amy Turner opened their quilt shop in 2017 with the goal of opening an overnight retreat facility one day. Instead of purchasing new land, the Turners decided to convert half of their working ranch into retreat accommodations. Construction started on their Ranch in late 2020 and Dean's Cottage officially opened in 2021 and Maxine's Manor opened a year later in 2022. Lovingly named after Amy's mother, Dean's Cottage is a 3,000 square foot home that has been converted to a modern farmhouse retreat. With accommodations for up to 8 guests, the Cottage is the perfect setting for your next intimate retreat. Lovingly named after Laura's Mother, Maxine's Manor is in a large 6,400 square foot building that has been converted to every crafter's dream. With accommodations for up to 24 guests, the Manor is the perfect setting for large groups, or for individuals to come and meet new friends.

Wow, **Box Car** knows how to treat a quilter!! I attended a special overnight retreat that featured an all day event with flowers, drawing, fabric making and pil-

lows and was NOT disappointed. It was a terrific event which carried over into an evening of more sewing on my own projects and some very delicious food. I'm a

What I say: I did not get the chance to visit the smaller venue, but Maxine's manor has all of the modern extras that any quilter would want. There are spacious adjustable tables for each quilter, a side table for your ironing/cutting needs and very comfortable chairs. The sewing room is well lit, with lots of room to move around. There are plenty of design walls and large ironing and cutting tables throughout the room. They have a very nice dining room and kitchen set up, a living room with comfy chairs and couches and a large TV. There are 4 large bathrooms for the retreaters to share, 2 in each wing of the building that were always available while I was there! The food is provided by a caterer and all the utensils, paper goods are provided. The meals were delicious and all leftovers are placed in the ginormous refrigerators for midnight snacking! I think the crowning glory of my stay was the bed...oh yes, it was wonderful. I'm normally not too picky about sleeping accommodations while on retreat, but this bed was beyond anything I've ever experienced on a retreat! Trust me!! You will not be disappointed!

I've already booked Maxine's for one of my bee groups next year and can't wait to visit again. Check them out on their website, call them or visit when you can. The Box Car Quilt Shop is fabulous as well and just a short drive away.

Bear Creek Quilt Guild Board Zoom Meeting October 4, 2022

President, Kathi Runyan opened the meeting at 6:34 pm on ZOOM with the following officers and members present: Kathi Runyan, Kay Thomas, Kathy Longo, Aleta Mayrose, Pam Roark, Vicky Kidd, Mary Nalley, Kyle Mills, Nancy Carr, JoAnne Sheppard, Mona Levingston, and Michelle Lewis. Kathi welcomed everyone to the meeting. September Board minutes were reviewed and motion to accept was made by Aleta Mayrose with a second by Kyle Mills, and the motion passed.

<u>Treasurer's Report:</u> Kyle reported for the month of September an income of \$6906.03 (fall retreat, miscellaneous donation), disbursements of \$150.00 (speaker fee), with a net income of \$6756.03. Proposed budget for 2023 discussed; a motion to approve as amended was made by Kay Thomas and seconded by Nancy Carr. Proposed budget will be presented to members at this month's general meeting for review.

<u>Unfinished Business:</u> We have a slate of new officer candidates for the upcoming elections at the November meeting. Any vacant positions on the committees will be filled by request of the newly elected President.

Quilt Show: Numbers are still being calculated and are not available. The Expo is delayed in delivering the numbers and checks to the committee. There is a meeting being held this month to finalize everything to calculate totals; more to follow.

New Business:

November meeting: At the November meeting, we will be conducting the Quilts of Valor presentations and a New Member Welcome. Doors will open at 6 pm for the New Member Welcome. We should expect approximately 15 new members. Kathi will send an email invite, and membership is asked to reach out/invite new members who have joined the guild in the last 24 months to attend. Refreshments will be provided. Officers and Committee Chairs should be in attendance to welcome new members and discuss their responsibilities.
