### A Special THANK YOU to Mrs. Paula Burda

We hear about them and we often see them in the media. They are the quiet every-day people in our communities who share their time and talents to help others. Mrs. Burda is one of these quiet heroes. When the pandemic first started, Mrs. Burda thought that, due to the mask shortage, she would begin making masks.



Mrs. Paula Burda is the mother of Phil Burda, Information Systems Administrator at MFA. In fact, she discovered her love of sewing while making her first quilt when she was expecting Phil. She recently retired after 20 years of operating a home quilting business, Sew Creative, in the Keller, TX area. Through the years, she has made and repaired many quilts for customers, family, and friends. She still finds time to participate in quilting bees and quilting contests.

To help his Mom get started making masks, Phil found information for making masks on the CDC website and shared the instructions with her. Many of her mask creations (estimated over 700) have been sent to employees and contractors at MFA. As generous as she has been to us, she did not stop there. She has made masks for Phil's brother and his coworkers, and of course, there are masks for her daughters, grandchildren, foster children, and church members. At the time this article was written, she had made over 2,300 masks.

Phil's dad takes over when it comes to shipping, and he will not seal the box until he arrives just in case he runs into someone who should need a mask along the way.

Mrs. Burda is currently working on a quilt project for a friend but will resume her mask making soon. Her next endeavor will be making masks for local Keller, TX elementary school children who will need them as they return to the classroom.

If you see a unique mask while at work, chances are it was handmade by Mrs. Burda. Thank you, Mrs. Burda, for helping to keep us safe!
