North Texas Quilt Festival Update

Many of you are wondering what the status is of the August opening of the North Texas Quilt Festival and Original Sewing and Quilt Expo. The Show Committee is continuing to plan for these dates, but we are also developing contingency plans.

- 1. Entry fees Enter your quilts, sooner rather than later! No fees will be charged until after July 20th when we are all confident the show will take place.
- 2. Ticket Sales Ticket sales can begin a little before Independence Day, 4th of July and we'll have to work hard to get them sold in July and early August.
- 3. Possible postponement to a future date If State and local health officials feel it's not safe, then we will announce future dates. But we hope it doesn't come to that. We're optimistic the great state of Texas will begin to reopen businesses in May and we will have the necessary measures and guidelines in place by August.

We're 100% committed to the health and safety of everyone who attends and we'll keep you apprised of the updates and changes we'll be making to assure NTQF is busy but safe for everyone.

Doing more sewing while sheltering in place? Don't forget to save your empty spools and bring them to a meeting. Only regular spools, please. NO CONES. Thank you!



DIRECTIONS FOR THE APRIL BLOCK LOTTO

Welcome to the April Block Lotto! Our block this month is titled "Spring Bloomers". It is a 14" finished block and we will be reproducing this block in shades of <u>Spring</u>. Blocks <u>may</u> contain more than one fabric pattern in each color.

NOTE: A limited number of copies of the directions will be available for those of you who are not able to access the internet. Just let me know you need them and I will email/snail mail them to you.

Remember, you need only make one block per pattern month to be eligible to win blocks for that month at the June meeting. You may make more than one if you would like more than one chance at the finished blocks. Fabrics should be quilt quality and finished blocks submitted should measure at least 14 ½". **DO NOT TRIM** your finished block. We will leave that up to the lucky quilter(s) who win(s) the blocks.

April blocks should be returned at the next meeting, June 23rd. The drawing will take place at the end of the meeting. The winner will have enough blocks for a beautiful quilt project.
